
# Giving Resource Guide

Disaster Does Not Define Us: Creating and Rebuilding Resilient Communities



## Introduction

In recent years, the world has witnessed a persistent and ongoing global trend of increasingly devastating disasters. These disasters range in size, scale and scope but can often be categorized as complex humanitarian emergencies, man-made accidents, or natural hazards and severe weather events. For those interested in supporting both disaster readiness and relief efforts in the United States and abroad, this guide presents a list of nonprofit organizations working globally to prepare for and alleviate the impact of humanitarian, man-made, and natural disasters. The nonprofits featured support resiliency and relief efforts across a range of service areas including health, child support, food, housing, and other programmatic areas that assist communities before, during and after disaster strikes. The roster of organizations also includes nonprofits working directly in the impacted communities with a place-based, local partnership approach towards recovery and relief that is intentionally tailored to the unique needs of the affected community.

This list is meant to be a sampling of nonprofits providing support around disaster preparedness and relief as there are many other organizations engaged in incredible work around the world. The organizations listed below have been reviewed by third-party sources and the Philanthropy Management team. Overview: The mission of Doctors Without Borders/Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF) is to provide impartial medical relief to the victims of war, disease, and natural or man-made disaster, without regard to race, religion, or political affiliation. The people who work for MSF are doctors, nurses, midwives, epidemiologists, water-and-sanitation experts and many others who combine their professional expertise with a commitment to the world's most vulnerable people. They frequently run programs in remote locations and are often the first international aid workers to arrive at the scene of an emergency—ranging from areas devastated by earthquakes or floods to epidemic outbreaks and armed conflicts.

Overview: Feeding America is the largest charity working to end hunger in the United States. They partner with food banks and local food programs to feed the hungry. When disaster strikes, Feeding America is on the ground and ready to provide food assistance and emergency supplies. They're ready to help neighbors who suddenly need extra support after a disaster.

Overview: When disaster strikes, Give2Asia's network of local disaster response charities provides immediate relief and facilitates long-term recovery. DisasterLink is a network of 51 trusted partners in 20 locations at high risk or vulnerability for natural disasters. Each pre-positioned member is highly invested in the areas they serve, enabling them to help communities rebuild and recover long after the immediate crisis is over. Successful disaster response depends on proper preparation.

The organization works as a first responder for disaster relief, bridges the gap between first response and development, and implements practices to ensure sustainable development. GEM has supported missions in all 50 states and over 46 countries around the world, providing assistance to millions of people.

Overview: Heart to Heart Int. strengthens communities through improving health access, providing humanitarian development and administering crisis relief worldwide. During a crisis, Heart to Heart Int. works closely with its local charities and NGOs to ensure the aid given will be of real benefit to those affected by the crisis. Assessment of the situation continues throughout the response period to ensure that the help being offered is commensurate with the need. HHI continues to assist people in the affected area until their local healthcare system is functioning at or near, pre-crisis capacity. Because of a 25 year partnership with FedEx, HHI can provide rapid deployment of medical supplies, medicines and hygiene kits to affected areas. For disasters within the US, HHI can deploy its Mobile Medical Unit (MMU), which serves as a clinic on wheels where healthcare providers can see patients in a professional, well-equipped and well-stocked setting.

#### **International Medical Corps**

**Overview**: International Medical Corps provides training and delivers healthcare and related services to those affected by conflict, natural disaster or disease. They train people in their own communities, providing them the skills needed to recover, to chart their own path to self-reliance and to shape their own future as they become effective First Responders. Combined with pre-positioned stocks of essential supplies, and ongoing partnerships with both international and local aid groups, International Medical Corps maintains the needed surge capacity to respond to emergencies in the most challenging environments, regardless of scale or geographic location.

They also organize and prepare communities to provide childcare when their communities are impacted by disasters. During emergencies, access to free, quality childcare is important to support children's mental wellbeing and provides parents with time to process and make necessary plans. But too often this critical component of community recovery is missing. Project: Camp fills this gap.
